The Benton Legacy cabin will allow campers and staff to enjoy camp in a cabin setting with modern handicap accessible facilities. Our goal is to raise \$15,000 to build the cabin.

What a pleasure it was for us to see her smile and giggle as she was in the motorboat during the waterskiing activity or see her joy when we made tin-foil dinners on the campfire or see her shoot the bow and arrow during archery.
