On February 27, 2021 we had a wonderful event featuring five of our special global servants. Here are some of the highlights of 4 of the 5 presentations.

Larry and Becky Stanton – Hungary – Larry has been working with the refugees and in Croatia due to the earthquake there. He worked on a barn there for a farmer. In Hungary the schools are open but the high school is closed due to Covid. Ruth, their oldest will be going to high school in 2 years. Pray for her. They say "thank you for your support".

Katie and Taku Longkummer – Northeast India – They are working with the Council of Baptist Churches of NE India. There are 8100 churches there. NE Christian University, our special project 2 years ago, is preparing missionaries. We gave \$15,000 for the women's dormitory and was dedicated in 2019 by Rev. Dr. Joseph Huse. There are 250 acres in Nagaland. There are computers for the students. The school is offering a certification for health care providers, as well as liberal arts and theology.

Brian and Lynette Smith – Dominican Republic – They are now in La Romana settling in learning the local language. They still work with the Haitians in DR and speaking Kreol. God stretched them across the island by being a bridge from DR to Haiti. Brian is working construction. Lynette is instructing the women in creative art. The boys are making friends with the local children.

Deliris and Moise Carrion-Joseph – Tijuana, Mexico – They are working at Deborah House with refugee women and children victimized by domestic violence. They have a daily devotional, vocational training, such as sewing and beauty. Great Rivers Region raised \$15,000 to complete the library and a classroom. They serve Haitians and Africans in Tijuana. They have a dental and medical clinic and help migrants get papers to work in Mexico. Moise is translating at the border.

Please keep these wonderful global servants in your prayers and donate to their monthly support, as they are all in need of funds. Also pray for Scott and Tan Coats who are stationed in Myanmar but cannot get there due to military uprisings. They are in Thailand near the border.

Coronavirus cases and deaths are hitting new record highs with the third wave. Both the Stantons and the Goodes have returned to the United States. Communication (from Latin communicare, meaning "to share") is the act of developing meaning among entities or groups through the use of sufficiently mutually understood signs, symbols, and semiotic conventions.

Learning how to share with those who matter to us during the past year has become an adventure in new things. Families and churches now use ZOOM to meet face to face, prayer groups use conference calls to update prayer lists, families keep up through Facebook or Instagram, we check in with loved ones by texting, or phone when we used to meet face-to-face to fellowship. But the way we communicate with God has not changed.

So, how do we share with God?

- 1. Pray wherever you are, any time day or night.
- 2. Use prayer to express your thoughts and emotions. God as a loving, infinitely wise parent will hear you.

- 3. Set aside a few minutes to dedicate to prayer and reading the Bible
- 4. Keep a prayer journal if you like to write or keep a prayer jar to fill with your prayers.
- 5. Offer wordless prayer through your actions.

Our conversations with God may be spoken or written or in our minds. It may be in our prayer closet alone or with another person or in a group. We may pray for God to intercede, for blessings, for healing, for praise, for thanksgiving, or just because we need to feel his presence.

We can be confident that he hears us and that the Holy Spirit will hear the groaning of our hearts and what we have no words to express. Romans 8:26 says, "In the same way, the Spirit helps us in our weakness, We do not know what to pray for, but the Spirit himself intercedes for us with groans that words cannot express."

Each recipient must be contacted or they must let us know if they want continued support. As long as they are still attending and making passing grades they will be granted continuing scholarship. They may have a scholarship for 4 years undergraduate and 3 years seminary but must request each year.

I wanted to share with you how we have tried to keep mission giving alive in our church, First Baptist Church. White Hall II. I resigned as church treasurer at the end of 2019 after serving 15 years as church treasurer. Part of my job was to forward to ABC Great Rivers Region the mission giving from each weekly church offering. I found over the years that fewer and fewer of our congregation was giving to missions. This was due mainly to the fact that we have lost so many of our older ladies, all who were strong supporters of missions. The make-up of our congregation today is very different from what it was even 15 years ago. We have very few ladies who were involved in our Inez Green Mission Circle. We have a lot of members who have transferred to our church from other churches or baptized into our church later in life. We do have a lot of our younger and middle aged members who grew up in our church too. These younger members tend to lean more on supporting local community ministries or projects, and our church does support the local community very well.

Therefore, as treasurer when our finance committee prepared the budget for the year, I ask that we budget from our general offering a certain amount for mission giving, institutional giving and also our Inez Green Mission Circle giving. This was a guarantee that a certain amount would be given to those missions our church has always supported.

This worked fine over the 15 years I serviced as treasurer. But then, when contemplating retiring, I realized that the new treasurer was not familiar with ABC missions . Beverly Moulton, the former president of our Inez Green Mission Circle, has always, very effectively promoted the four American Baptist Churchs' annual offerings. That still left the other mission giving to the treasurer to delegate and forward to ABC/Great Rivers Region. I did not want to overwhelm our new treasurer with this added duty as she is also our town City Clerk, and very busy.

Fortunately, I came up with the solution. I proposed to the finance committee that I would continue to fill out and decide where each month's funds would go. I then forward the form and my request for her to cut a check and forward the form and check to ABC/GRR. I so greatly appreciate that our dedicated church members have allowed me the opportunity to continue this very important part of First Baptist's love for missions.

Camp Ochomogo IN Costa Rica Goal \$15,000

Have you ever been to camp in the middle of summer? I remember going to, and then being a counselor at a camp on a lake in Maine and hoping that the activities I had were on the water. I remember teaching archery and air riflery in the hot summer Maine sun. I can only imagine trying to teach, play, and watch basketball in the hot sun of Costa Rica (and I thought Maine was hot.) Our \$15,000 will build a pavilion over the basketball court. This will allow relief from the hot sun, useable on rainy days, shade for Bible study, available for kids' games, and for larger group meeting. The pavilion would enable much more efficient use of the basketball court.

We have an amazing start to our \$15,000 goal and only have \$4907 to go. Maybe you haven't met in person but have some extra funds in your treasury; the Special Project would be a great way to donate the extra and make a difference in Costa Rica. Maybe you are looking for a project to give to the camp:

Take a special Easter offering in your church for the camp.

Throughout over 100 years we as American Baptist women have supported our ABC family, including our missionaries and mission centers both overseas and overland. We are a part of our large ABC family and family helps each other as needed. Here is how we will continue our outreach to missions through White Cross.

One urgent need now is Baby Birthing Kits for Congo. Updated directions are on the above website.

Overland White Cross is now called **Operation Planting Hope** through American Baptist Home Mission Societies. There is a new booklet describing Operation Planting Hope. If you would like a copy let Sharon know and she will mail it to you. The information is also at <u>abhms.org</u>. The booklet suggests we can spread out and do more but gives no tangible projects. We are small groups, mostly senior. Many of us do mission work in our own communities such as helping at Food Pantry, homeless shelter, etc. For many years we have helped Peoria Friendship House and Bethel Neighborhood Center, both associated with ABC and in our region, which can be our priority. One directive under Operation Planting Hope is, "Direct donations of goods to the ministry of your choice." Their needs at Peoria and Bethel are ongoing. Each group can give as they are able – no quota. For example, Marcellus at Peoria reported they give out on average 60 personal hygiene items each week such as disposable razors for homeless men and toothbrushes. The leaders at Peoria and Bethel have expressed their appreciation for all donations received.

We are re-writing our GRR ABWM bylaws. There will be no White Cross Coordinator. The Mission and Service Coordinator will encourage us to continue doing White Cross as described in this letter with an emphasis on ministry within our ABC family. There will be no recording or reports to send in.
