An update from our global servant in Ukraine, Kristy Engel.



"Kristy shares her heart about what she has seen and experienced while continuing to serve in Ukraine. She wrote it on the 1,000th day since the war began. "24,000 consecutive

hours," she writes, "of missiles, drones...loss of life. The journal is a mix of the stark reality many have forgotten as time has passed and the hope that only God can bring in the middle of crisis and devastation.

"Imagine what life would be like if you were born in Kyiv and not Kansas City. Or Odessa and not Orlando," she writes. There is something powerful about remembering our shared humanity and taking a moment to think about the reality facing tens of thousands of people today.

Although donations, volunteers, and government funding have decreased (or stopped completely in some cases), the need has not; it has remained unchanged, making resources scarce. And yet..."Where there is hope, there is love, and where there is love, there is God."

Kristy shares how God is seen through the laughter and voices of children and the boxes of food brought to the shelter. She encourages us to pray, learn, and share if we cannot give or go. The work is far from over in Ukraine and it is not easy, but she (and we) can "choose hope over despair, action over silence, and love over hate.

As you read this heartfelt journal, pray for Kristy, our ministry partners in Ukraine and the people they serve, that God would provide for their needs and encourage their souls."
